Parsha Questions

- 1. When did the obligation to bring *bikkurim* (first fruits) begin?
- 2. From which crops must one bring bikkurim?
- 3. The Torah praises *Eretz Yisrael* as "a land flowing with milk and honey (26:9)." To what type of honey does the Torah refer?
- 4. How is a person supposed to designate his bikkurim?
- 5. Who waves the basket containing the bikkurim?
- 6. The person bringing the *bikkurim* begins reciting, "An Aramean tried to destroy my forefather." Who was that Aramean?
- 7. The "Syrian" mentioned in verse 26:5, didn't destroy the Jewish People, he merely tried to destroy them. Why does the Torah record the event as if it had actually occurred?
- 8. When a person brings *bikkurim*, during which part of the year is he required to "recite" from the Torah the special verses?
- 9. How does Hashem bless a person who brought *bikkurim* as proscribed by the Torah?

- 10. How many stones were the Jewish People commanded to set up?
- 11. The Jewish People were commanded to explain the Torah *heiteiv* (clearly) on the stones that they set up. How?
- 12. Who recited the blessing and curses?
- 13. Who "causes the blind go astray?"
- 14. How does one "strike another secretly?"
- 15. How is the manner of expressing the curses in Parshas Bechukosai more severe than in this week's Parsha?
- 16. What is meant by "the Jewish People will become a proverb?"
- 17. Why did all the curses expressed in 48:16-44 befall the Jewish People?
- 18. "In the morning you shall say, 'If only it were (last) evening' and in the evening you will say, 'If only it were (this) morning' (28:67)." Why?
- 19. To which tribe did Moshe give the Torah first?
- 20. How long does it take to understand the depth of one's teacher's wisdom?

Answers to this Week's Questions

All references are to the verses and Rashi's commentary, unless otherwise stated

- 1. 26:1 After the Land was conquered and divided.
- 2. 26:2 The seven species for which *Eretz Yisrael* is praised.
- 3. 26:2 Date honey.
- 4. 26:2 When he sees the first fruit that has ripened on a tree, he should bind a piece of straw around it to mark it as a first fruit.
- 5. 26:4 The *kohen* places his hands under the hands of the one bringing it, and they wave the basket together.
- 6. 26:5 Lavan.
- 7. 26:5 Because when judging the non-Jewish nations, Hashem accounts their evil intentions as actual deeds.
- 8. 26:11 From Shavuos until Succos.
- 9. 26:16 "You brought *bikkurim* today, so too will you be privileged to bring them next year."
- 10. 27:2 A total of 36: 12 along the Jordan River; 12 in Gilgal; and 12 on Mt. Eval.

- 11. 27:8 By writing the Torah in 70 languages.
- 12. 27:12 The Levi'im.
- 13. 27:18 Any person who intentionally gives bad advice.
- 14. 27:24 By slandering him.
- 15. 28:23 In *Bechukosai*, the Torah teaches in the plural, whereas, in this *Parsha*, the curses are taught in the singular.
- 16. 28:37 Whenever someone wants to express the idea of extraordinary suffering they will use the Jewish People as an example.
- 17. 28:47 Because they did not serve Hashem with gladness when everything was abundant.
- 18. 28:67 Because the curse of each hour will be greater than that of the previous hour.
- 19. 29:3 To the Tribe of Levi.
- 20. 29:8 40 years
